1. CSMVS Museum (formerly, Prince of Wales Museum): [Locate on Google Maps](#)

Established in 1872 as Mumbai's first museum, the Dr. Bhau Daji Lad Mumbai City Museum showcases the city's cultural heritage and history through a rare collection of Fine and Decorative Arts that document the life of its people.

4. Mani Bhavan Gandhi Sangrahalaya: [Locate on Google Maps](#)

Mani Bhavan is a place where Mahatma Gandhi lived and interacted with his colleagues to mould the freedom movement in India, in the image of the cherished ideals of Truth and Non-violence.

5. Gateway of India: [Locate on Google Maps](#)

Gateway of India, famous for its Indo-Saracenic style of architecture, was built in 1924 to welcome King George V and Queen Mary to Mumbai and in 1948, the last set of British troops left India through this gateway. With its regal arches, this colossal monument stands guard facing the Arabian Sea and is the most popular tourist attraction in Mumbai along with being the unofficial icon of the city.

Visiting hours: Anytime during the day (can club the visit to Gateway with Lunch or Dinner at Taj Mahal Palace)

6. Taj Mahal Palace: [Locate on Google Maps](#)

When the Taj opened in 1903, it was the first in India to have: electricity, American fans, German elevators, Turkish baths and English butlers. Later it also had the city's first licensed bar, India's first all-day restaurant, and the India's first discotheque, Blow Up. A lesser known fact is that the Taj was converted into a 600-bed hospital during World War I.
